Himachal institute shows the way to financial independence



FROM being a white elephant to an organisation generating resources worth crores, Himachal Pradesh Institute of Public Administration (HIPA) has come a long way in less than five years.

HIPA's journey to financial riches started in 2003 soon after the state government agreed to let it impart in-service training to state officials, and retain the funds generated by this exercise.

"That was the time when we did not even have a decent teaset and there was a flurry on the campus when the chief minis-



ter suddenly announced a visit", recalls Ajay Mittal, the director, adding how the Institute that dates back to 1974 now boasts a revenue of over Rs 10 crore which it spends it on the upkeep and extension

of the sprawling premises located at Mashobra, about 12 kilometres from here.

The turnaround began when the department set up a cooperative society called the HIPA Hospitality and Cooperative Society. The Society set in motion a proactive plan of hosting conferences, seminars, training modules and workshops. HIPA developed its premises in a way so as to make it possible for 200 delegates to attend various programmes at one go. It also spruced up about 70 rooms to accommodate delegates. A common mess was set up and revenue was generated through renting out these facilities.

Besides the government departments, the institute roped in NGOs, private organizations and public sector undertakings to hold conferences, etc, on its premises. "We encouraged them to utilise the facilities which cost them much more in hotels and resorts", says Mittal, a senior IAS officer.

The Society has already invested over Rs 7 crore in maintaining and upgrading the complex and has nearly Rs 4 crore in the bank. Its total receipts last year were Rs 1.67 crore as against the government budget of Rs 1.3 crore which went into paying staff salaries. The government now earmarks only a token sum of Rs 1,000 in the budget for the maintenance of the institute.

The Society foots the salary bill of staff on contract besides paying for electricity, water and maintenance.

Now it proposes to encourage private companies and other government undertakings to use the amenities available at the institute which include a well-kept library with over 40,000 books and important journals. The entire complex, including all the 70 guest bedrooms, enjoy 24-hour access to the internet. "It provides the right

ambience for study and workshops", says a lecturer, who is on the institute's guest faculty.

MINISTRY OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT

I visited the H.P. State Institute of Rural Development, Shimla on 23.6.2007. Smt. Smita Chugh, Joint Secretary (Trg.) and Sh. E.J. Jos, Deputy Secretary (Trg.) in the MoRD, accompanied me during this visit.

I am informed that the SIRD, HP is part of a composite unit which combines both the SIRD & the State Administrative Training Institute and is popularly known as HIPA. Having visited the HP Institute as also some other State Institutes of Rural Development in the country, I get the impression that having the SIRD established as a joint institute with the State Administrative Training Institute seems to be working better not only in terms of effecting economy but also to utilize the available infrastructure and resources, physical financial as well as human with optimum benefits.

It was indicated to me that HIPA is organizing approximately 250 training programme every year on various aspects of Rural Development, Panchayati Rai, Financial Management, Office Procedure, Public Administration, Right to Information, Disaster Management, Protection of Human Rights, Consumer Protection, NREGA, RTI, Women Empowerment, Information Technology and other subjects at its own campus at Fairlawns, Shimla and also at district levels. More than 3000 officers / officials and elected representatives of PRIs participated in various training programs during the last year. Both SIRD & ATI seem to be functioning smoothly under a single management team headed by the Director who is a senior officer of the State government from the IAS cadre. The arrangement seems to be working to the advantage of both the Institutions with each of them availing full benefit of infrastructural facilities, faculty and staff of each other. Training Division may like to study this model vis-à-vis the other available option of having separate SIRDs, which is already there in some other states, to explore if a uniform model can be suggested for adoption to the States. It may also be better to have this as a society with greater flexibility.

I visited the Dhauladhar Hostel of the Institute, the renovation work of which has been taken up with a grant of Rs. 43 lakhs sanctioned in Feb/March, 2007 by the MoRD. I found that the work has progressed very well and all the civil works of adding 12 number new toilets/Bath rooms to the Hostel and renovation of all the 21 old toilets/bathrooms have been completed. Director, HIPA informed that they were under pressure to put all the rooms to use during the summer months and therefore the replacement of old worn out furniture has been delayed temporarily. Since the summer season is now almost over I have no doubt that the remaining work will be completed as soon as possible. The quality of work done was excellent and is no doubt the result of constant monitoring of the work by the Institute authorities. Director, HIPA also informed me that the SIRD has already submitted the 'utilization certificate' for the amount released by the Ministry and requested for the release of balance amount of grant so that the furniture/ fixtures and other remaining work could be completed expeditiously.

I visited the Institute Library and found that the library has nearly 41000 books on a wide range of subjects. I was told that the catalogue of the library is now available on the internet thus saving a lot of time of the staff for search and retrieval of the books both to the staff and the users. The upkeep and maintenance of the library was commendable. The Director informed me that they have made a request for financial assistance to the Ministry for purchase of books and for installation of some computers and a photocopier in the library. This may be considered on priority.

The Institute has established 2 computer training labs with facilities to impart training to 60 persons at a time. High quality ICT infrastructure is available in the centre and seems to be well may retained. I was informed that during the last year HIPA provided basic computer training to nearly 3000 government officials mainly from the departments of Water Supplies, Rural Development, Panchayati Raj, Land Revenue and Treasury. The Institute has also set up District level training centres at Mandi, Dharamshala and Chamba mainly for imparting computer training and an extensive training programme to ensure 100% coverage of RD and Panchayati Raj officials in the districts of Chamba and Sirmaur (2 NREGA districts) has already been started. The training is likely to be completed by October 31st, 2007. HIPA proposes to cover the 2 new NREGA districts of Kangra and Mandi thereafter for intensive coverage of RD and PR staff for basic computer training. I found that the entire campus of HIPA, including the hostels and the residences of staff, has been connected to the 'campus-wide network' and internet facility is available to all including the trainees and the visitors.

I took a round of the Institute and also visited Class Rooms, Conference Halls, Guest Houses, Hostels, Kitchen and the Dining Hall. The whole place seems to be live with activity and the standards of maintenance of everything in the Institute including the corridors, public areas and the lawns were found to be of highly standards. However it was noticed that the Institute lacks in providing sports and recreational facilities. Director, HIPA informed me that they have already identified the site for adding an Auditorium building to the Institute which will also provide space for sports, recreation and other facilities apart from some additional guest rooms for the visiting faculty and officers. The proposal involves dismantling of 2 old outhouses buildings which are presently housing 6 officials and their families. The space that becomes available after dismantling the out houses will be sufficient to construct a building housing the Auditorium and other required infrastructure. The estimated cost for the project would be approximately Rs. 5 crores for which the Director HIPA made a request that the Ministry may consider funding this project. Director, HIPA has been advised to make out a complete proposal in this regard and send it to the Ministry for consideration. This may be considered on priority.

I found that the availability of faculty is a major constraint with the SIRD. Our scheme of funding up to 5 Core Faculty members in the SIRD has provided a lot of support to the SIRDs in this regard but a lot still remains to be done. I would suggest that we may increase the number of Core Faculty support but keeping in view the performance of SIRDs. Himachal Pradesh SIRD seems to have done a lot of good work in the area of financial management of the DRDAs/Blocks. Similarly Orissa has done a lot of work in the area of IT and may other SIRDs may also have developed similar competencies. We may consider declaring these SIRDs as 'National / Regional Resource Centres' in the respective areas of excellence and provide some special support including faculty support to such SIRDs. Ministry may also consider specifically funding a post of Deputy Director (Information Systems) along with other support staff with a properly defined role for all the SIRDs.

I was happy to note that the institute is doing substantial rainwater harvesting.

Later I also visited an Extension Training Centre at Mashobra, Shimla. This has good infrastructure and is playing a good supplemental role in Human Resource Development.

We may give a fresh look to the institution of ETCs. in the eleventh plan.
