Vision

Ensure secured environment through punishment to offenders & protection to the innocent and protecting the interest of the State Government in subordinate courts in the State by representing and defending the State properly

Mission

To secure higher rate of conviction in

1. Session(heinous crimes like Rape, Murder, Dacoity), Non-session
2. Higher Success rate in Criminal appeals
3. Higher Success rate in Civil cases (on behalf of the State)
4. Ensure better human resource development by enhancing skills of its Prosecutors, offering better access to latest law by way of computerisation and providing other necessary infrastructure like accommodation etc.

Objective

- 1 To secure punishment to the criminals in subordinate courts in the State
- 2 To protect the interests of State in subordinate civil courts
- 3 Improve the quality of human resource in the Department
- 4 To provide better infrastructure to its officers and officials

Functions

- 1 To scrutinize charge sheets (challans) in criminal cases
- 2 To conduct civil, criminal and revenue litigation affecting the State and its officers in the various subordinate courts.
- 3 To examine judgments affecting the State and its officers and to advise the concerned Government Departments and District Magistrates whether further appeal/revision is to be filed on behalf of the State against the judgment/order passed against State.
- 4 To render legal advice to the Heads of the Departments, District Magistrates and other concerned Departments in respect of threatened and pending litigation affecting the State and its officers

1	To secure punishment to the criminals in subordinate courts in the State	Conviction rate in Session Trials (heinous crimes like murder, rape, dacoity, narcotic drugs related offences etc. etc.)	There are some cases which are classified as heinous crimes like murder, rape, attempt to murder, dacoity, NDPS offences, against women, SCs/STs etc. which are triable by the court of Sessions. The rate of conviction in session trials (heinous crimes) is 33 %.
		Conviction rate in non-session trials	The cases which are not of heinous nature or as classified in the IPC, and tried by the lower courts like Judicial Magistrates. Presently the rate of conviction in such cases is 33%.
		Number of criminal appeals decided in favour of the State (success rate in criminal appeals)	Appeals in the court of District & Sessions Judge are filed in the criminal cases which end in acquittal or inadequate sentence is passed. Presently the percentage of appeals decided in favour of the State is 58%
2	To protect the interests of State in subordinate civil courts	Number of cases decided in favour of the State (success rate in civil cases)	The Law Officers of this Department represent and defend the State in subordinate courts viz. Civil Judge (Junior and Senior Divisions), Additional District Judges and District Judges in case filed by or against the State of HP which involve government property in the form of land, buildings, government money in case of land acquisition etc. The cases are conducted by the Attorneys on the basis of record provided by the concerned Departments.
3	Improve the quality of human resource in the Department	Number of officers/officials who attended the trainings, workshops or refresher courses	Officers/ officials of this Department are nominated to attend various trainings, workshops, refresher courses conducted by various Institutes like HIPA, INCFS LNJN New Delhi, HP Judicial Academy, FSL Junga and others. In the year 2009-10, 84 officers of this Department attended such courses and in 2010-11, 100 officers/official attended the same. Efforts will be made to sponsor more and more officers to improve their skills in discharging their duties.

		Number of vacancies filled up	Hundred percent incumbency is utmost necessary for the efficient working of the Department and to achieve the target. For want of adequate human resources/manpower, it is very difficult to conduct civil and criminal cases. Presently there are 40 posts of various categories lying vacant and efforts will be made to fill up all the vacancies on year basis.
4	To provide better infrastructure to its human resource	Number of laptops provided to the Prosecutors (one laptop per Prosecutor)	Providing basic infrastructure to its offices is one of the priorities of the Department and efforts are afoot to provide computers and laptops to all the Prosecutors of this Department and in this year 30 laptops have been provided and in the ensuing years, all the officers/Prosecutors will be provided with laptops.
		Number of new office or residential accommodations completed during the year	Presently at 10 places, the work of construction of office/residential accommodation is going on and in a phased manner, office/residential accommodation will be constructed in respect of each office of the Prosecution Department in the State.
