Youth in remote areas using RTI to raise public issues

The initiative taken by the Himachal Institute of Public Administration (HIPA) to create awareness among people, particularly in the backward areas, about the Right to Information (RTI) Act has brought to fore the efforts being made by youth in remote areas of the state to expose corruption at the grassroots.

students and they were regularly attending school during the period and had even appeared in board exams. Similarly four others, includ-scam and some persons were ing two women, were midday meal workers and one person was working as a water carrier in a school.

He filed a complaint with the Deputy Commissioner with all documents and an inquiry was ordered. The report of the block development officer who conducted the inquiry clearly stated that there was bungling and on its basis, the pradhan was suspended. However, Mohinder Singh laments that the government took no action against the officials, includ-

grants were secured by women who were not widows and the beneficiaries mostly related to the local panchayat functionaries. He had to face the wrath of his community for raising the issue and was virtually ostracised.
