- Q.3 Write short notes on the following:
- (a) Simple hurt and grievous hurt. (5 marks)
 - (b) Wrongful restraint and wrongful confinement. (5 marks)
 - (c) Abduction and kidnapping. (5 marks)
 - (d) Common intention and common object. (5 marks)

- Q.4 Explain the provisions of the Code of Criminal Procedure for keeping peace for the purpose of preventing offences and briefly discuss the procedure for the same. (20 marks)
- Q.5 Distinguish between summons case and warrant case. Describe the procedure for trial of summons case. (20 marks)
- Q.6 (a) What is the procedure given in the Cr.P.C. when the investigation of criminal case cannot be completed in 24 hours? Explain in detail. (10 marks)
- (b) When a police officer can make arrest without warrant? What are the rights available to accused person after arrest? (10 marks)

- Q.7 What do you understand by confession? Whether confession before a police officer leading to recovery of weapon of offence is admissible in a criminal trial? (20 marks)
- Q.8 What is secondary evidence? When secondary evidence relating to documents may be given. (20 marks)
- Q.9 What is 'dying declaration'? What are essential requirements for recording 'dying declaration'? (20 marks)
