- Q.2 (a) What is the definition of a 'protected forest'? What is the difference between the Protected forest and the reserved forest? (10 marks)
 - (b) Under what circumstances an authorized forest officer can order the confiscation of forest produce seized in connection with the commission of a forest offence. Whether the confiscation of the forest produce can be ordered before filing of the challan in the court?

- Q.3 (a) When a public servant is said to have committed the offence of criminal misconduct under the Prevention of Corruption Act? Explain. (10 marks)
 - (b) Whether the prosecution sanction is required to prosecute a public servant under the Prevention of Corruption Act? Discuss in detail by referring to the provisions of the Prevention of Corruption Act.

- Q.4 (a) What are various types of driving licence? Describe the procedure for issuance of the driving licence? (10 marks)
 - (b) Under what circumstances a stage carriage vehicle can be allowed temporarily to operate as a contract carriage vehicle? What procedure is to be followed in such cases?

- Q.5 (a) Under what circumstances an article of food shall be deemed to be misbranded under the Prevention of Food Adulteration Act? (10 marks)
 - (b) What are the powers of food inspector under the Prevention of Food Adulteration Act? Explain in detail. (10 marks)
- Q.6 (a) Write a detailed note on the powers of the court to release certain offenders on probation of good conduct under the Probation of Offender Act? Can a court require released offenders under the Act to pay compensation or the costs?

- (b) Explain the powers of the government with respect to the absconding person to whom a detention order has been issued under the Conservation of Foreign Exchange and Prevention of Smuggling Activities Act? Whether a person can be detained for period more than 3 months? (10 marks)
- Q.7 (a) Explain the provisions under which the District Magistrate/Sub-Divisional Magistrate can exercise control over the police under the Police Act. (10 marks)
 - (b) What are the duties of the police officers under the Police Act? Who can stop any procession with regard to assemblies and processions violating the conditions of the licence?
