- Q. No. 1 (a) An information was received at Police Station Sadar Shimla about some dispute and fight on 21-06-2012 at Kutub Masjid, Shimla. Head Constable Joginder along with constable Santosh were deputed to go on spot on the said information. On the spot they found that few persons were fighting. This fight was between two groups. Javad, Irshad & Mohd. Rehman were in one group and the other group was of Mohd. Meharban, Mohd. Eshrar & Mohd. Rehman. Even on the best intervention of these police personal they kept on fighting. Resultantly, they all were arrested. They all were taken to DDU hospital where they were medically examined. Thereafter, they were taken to Police Station. At Police Station one Mohd. Mastbeen also reached and started quarrelling with Javad and his group. He was also arrested. During enquiry statements were also recorded. Kalandra of the case Annexure C-1 was prepared & statements of witnesses as recorded Annexure C2 to C5 were also enclosed. On the basis of these material, draw a notice u/s111 CrPC. against one of the respondent. (15)
- b) Whether Executive Magistrate, Shimla can ask the respondents to execute the Bond with Surety or without Surety until the enquiry is concluded? Explain in detail. (15)
- c) Write a detailed final order on the basis of statements of witnesses on the case file, to be taken as if recorded by the Executive Magistrate, Shimla, after the contents of notice sent under section 111 Cr. P. C were admitted by the respondents. (20)

Q. No2 Kuldeep kumar, Kapil Shandil, Dharmender thakur & Manjeet prakash in furtherence of common intention wrongfully restrained Vinay bhagnal & Anish while they were on their way to Shamti in their vehicle No. DL-7CC-8657 on 7-9-2011 at around 3.30 P. M at Kotla nallah Solan, HP. They also voluntarily gave beatings to both Vinay bhagnal & Anish and caused injuries to them. It was also alleged that they broke the glass panes of the aforesaid vehicle owned by Anish. Viney bhagnal reported the matter to police station Sadar, Solan by a written complaint. On this the FIR was registered.. Thereafter, during the investigation of the case, investigation officer prepared the spot map and took the photographs of the spot. The damaged car was also taken into possession by the I. O. Both, Vinay & Anish were got medically examined by the I. O. The medical officer issued MLC of both Vinay & Anish and opined the injuries on both of them as simple in nature. Thereafter, the IO examined five persons and recorded their statements as witnesses under sec 161 Cr. C. as per their version. The investigation officer after completing the other codal formalities, final report under Sec. 173 Cr. P. C, Annecure A-1 was prepared and filed in the court.

- a) Prepare the Notice of accusations against all the accused. (10)
- b) Accused kuldeep kumar, Dharmender thakur, Manjeet and Kapil Shandil pleaded not guilty to the accusation. Prosecution examined 6 witnesses in support of it's case, which are annexed with final report as Annexure A-2 to A- 7. On the basis of evidences produced during trial, examine all the accused on the evidences which has come against them as envesiged in Section 313 of Cr. P. C. (10) •
- c) In their statements as recorded under section 313 Cr. PC all the accused denied all the evidences and ciccumstances of the Prosecution case. Write down the reasoned judgement on the basis of evidences recorded and documents exhibited in the court. (Annexure A-2 to A-16)

Question 1:

- (a) A Suit for ejectment was brought by Sarvshri Khem Chand etc. Plaintiff against Shri Bidoo- Defendant in court of Assistant Collector 1st Grade under section 58 (3)(d) of the H.P. Tenancy and Land Reforms Act, 1972. The brief facts of the pleadings of both parties are given below:- On the basis of pleadings;
- i. Frame the issues. (20 Marks)
 - ii. In the light of the evidence and arguments given below, give findings on each issue and write the judgment accordingly. (30 Marks)

PLAINT

1. That the petitioners were owners to the extent of half share and the defendant owner to the extent of another $\frac{1}{2}$ share of Khasra Nos. 159 to 172 area 2-1-3 Bighas of land in Mohal Kumarsain and that the defendant was also entered as non-occupancy tenant of the $\frac{1}{2}$ share in the ownership of the plaintiffs.
2. That the defendant failed to cultivate the land comprising Kh. Nos. 159 to 172 for the period Rabi 1970 to Kharif 1974.
- 3 That the defendant was to pay $\frac{1}{4}$ th share to the produce of his tenancy as per the agreement recorded to the effect in the Jamabandi.
4. That as per Naksha Normal Rate Bazari Rate rent of Rs. 500 would have been payable, and cultivation been done in the customary manner.
5. The Plaintiffs prayed that the defendant be ordered to pay Rs. 500 with cost and be ejected from Khasra Nos. 159 to 172 under section 34 (1)(b) of the Act.

WRITTEN STATEMENT: -

1. Para 1 of plaint denied to the extent that defendant has now gained ownership rights on the remaining half share, as a consequence to operation of section 104 of the Tenancy & Land Reforms Act, 1972, from 1-1-75.
2. Para 2 denied.
3. Para 3 admitted. The 1/4th share has been paid to the owners.
4. Para 4 not admitted due to lack of knowledge.
5. Para 5 denied. The defendant has paid the rent. Even if he has not, since he has now gained ownership, the present suit cannot be brought against him. Even if it was held that the plaintiffs were entitled to all the relief of para 5 of the plaint, this could not be given effect to, unless partition of the ownership was carried out on the land. Therefore, the present suit was pre-mature to the extent that the plaintiffs would first have to partition the land and then apply under section 58(3)(d) of the H.P. tenancy and Land Reforms Act. It was prayed that since the suit had been brought solely with the view of depriving the defendant from getting ownership of the land in his tenancy, it be dismissed with costs.

REPLICATION

It was admitted that the ownership of the land in the tenancy of the defendant had now been mutated in favour of the defendant as owners. However, all this was done in connivance with the Revenue authorities because the defendant knew that the plaintiffs were about to bring present suit against the defendant.

That the petitioners were entitled to all the reliefs mentioned in the plaints since the suit related to the period prior to conferment to ownership with right.

That there was no need for participation since the question was not of ownership, and this plea was being taken by the defendant only to delay proceedings.

(b) Evidence was led by both parties. For the Plaintiffs PWs. 1, 2 and 3 all residents of Kumarsain stated that Kn. Nos. 159 to 172 had not been brought under cultivation for the period rabi 1970 to Kharif 1974. PW. 4 (Office Kanungo) produced record to the effect that as per Naksha Normal and Bazari Rate rent payable was Rs.500. The plaintiffs also produced copy of Jamabandi for

the year 1970 showing the plaintiffs and defendant, each, owner to the extent of $\frac{1}{2}$ share, the defendant being entered in the possession column of the Jamabandi as "KHUD KAST, Bidoo HISSADAR MALIK NISAF, WA GAIR MAURUSI NISF MINJANIB DIGAR HISSADARAN".

Defendant produced no witnesses, but presented copy of the latest jamabandi in which, in the remarks column, entry regarding granting of ownership right of the remaining $\frac{1}{2}$ share due to operation of section 104 of the Tenancy & Land Reforms Act, 1972, was entered by the Patwari along with number and date of the mutation attested in this regard.

Arguments were heard from Counsels for both sides. Counsel for plaintiffs reiterated the pleadings and argued that since based on oral and documentary evidence it was proved that the defendant during the period of this tenancy was liable under section 34(1) (b) of the Tenancy & Land Reforms Act, 1972, the fact, that he was subsequently granted ownership made no difference to his liability. The defendant was not at all eligible for ownership once a court concluded that as tenant the defendant was liable for ejection.

For the defendant the pleas made in the written statement were again set forth and it was further argued that even if the Court concluded that the defendant was liable under section 34(1)(b), it could instead of making a decree, pass an order under section of 41(1) of the Tenancy and Land Reforms Act, 1972.

In the above facts and circumstances, write a speaking order and order sheet indicating; how will you decide different claims of the parties and final order/orders in the matter.

Question No.2

A non-agriculturist from Chandigarh namely Sh. Ram Prasad purchased a piece of land in the name of a land less labourer, Sh. Gulam Ravi by investing huge amount of money. Thereafter he constructed a huge structure on that land. In the revenue record it is the land less labourer who is the owner of the land and structure. Even concerned AC IInd Grade, Revenue officer attested the mutation in favour of landless labourer. The matter came to your notice; being collector of the area through a complaint made by some local resident. The factum of

complaint also came in the knowledge of Sh. Ram Prasad & Sh. Gulam Ravi. They immediately leased a portion of the structure to a Govt. department for 20 years on a handsome amount per year. The rest of the portion of the structure was converted in to a "Sarai" to be used by the pilgrims visiting the area. There being a temple in the vicinity of the structure.

Write an order sheet; indicating how to deal with the case. Is there any need to pass an interim order. Also write final order.

At the time of implementation of Himachal Pradesh Ceiling on Land Holding Act 1972, You were Collector of the District Kangra. A landlord of Palampur was owner of 3 acres of irrigated land growing 2 crops in a year, 5 acres of assured irrigation capable of one crop a year and 10 acres of land under orchard without any irrigation facility. In addition, he was owner of 900 Kanals of tea gardens. He was having his surviving wife, 2 married daughters and 2 married sons.

Write order sheet indicating various stages; how you would have proceeded in the matter and decided the case finally.

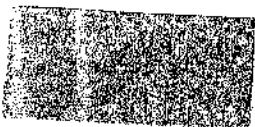
