Sub :- Release of sum of Rs. 2635.11 Lakh as grant-in-aid to the State Governments under the scheme for 'Crime & Criminal Tracking Network and System (CCTNS) for Additional New Police Stations in financial year 2016-17.

I am directed to refer to the subject mentioned above and to convey the sanction of the President for the payment of Rs. 2635.11 Lakhs (rupees twenty six hundred and thirty five lakhs and eleven thousand only) to the State Governments for further implementation of Crime and Criminal Tracking Network System (CCTNS) for the current financial year 2016-17 towards additional new Police Stations with following Break up.

2. The above amount will be sent through RBI advisory to the States. The State Government have to transfer above amount(s) to the implementing agency within 15 days of receipt from Central Government. Any delay will require the State Government to release the same with interest, at prevalent bank rate of RBI, for the period of default.

4. The expenditure involved in this Sanction is debatable to Demand no 48 Police; 3601 Grants-in aid to State Government (Major Head); 04.117 Police Other Grants; 01.04 Crime & Criminal Network Systems; 35 Grants for creation of capital assets for the year 2016-17.

5. All grantee shall ensure that the disbursed funds are utilized as per the norms and GFR codal formalities, and should not lead to parking of funds. The State Government is required to submit utilization certificate for the amount released under this head in the prescribed performa (Form -19-A) on due date to ministry of Home Affairs.

6. As per GFR rule 211 (1) the accounts of all grantees shall be made open to inspection by the sanctioning authority and the Internal Audit Wing of MHA, whenever the grantees are called upon to do so.

7. The grant may be released to the respective State Government immediately.

8. The sanction issues in exercise of the delegated power in consultation with Integrated Finance Division of this Ministry vide Dy. No. CF3055392/F-IV dated 29/09/2016.
