**Sub: Release of Grants-in-Aid (General) for Current Financial Year 2022-23 to the State Government of Himachal Pradesh for the implementation of Externally Aided GOI-UNDP-GEF “Securing Livelihoods, Conservation, Sustainable use and Restoration of High Range Himalayan Ecosystems (SECURE Himalaya Project), in Himachal Pradesh- reg.**

Sir,

This Ministry has concurred a total of Rs. 133.93952 lakh (Rupees One Crore, Thirty-Three Lakh Ninety-Three Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Two only), in FY 2022-23, for the implementation of the above project in Himachal Pradesh. Out of the total concurrence, the amount of Rs. 74.93952 lakh is to be spent by the State Government of Himachal Pradesh as Grants-in-Aid (General) and the balance Rs. 59.00 lakh is to be spent through the Country Office Support Services of UNDP under the Direct Payment Procedure of GFR-2017. An item-wise break-up of the sanctioned amount is provided in ANNEXURE.

2. I am directed to convey the sanction of the President of India for a total amount of Rs. 74.93952 lakh as Grants-in-Aid (General) for CFY 2022-23 and to release **Rs. 18.58774 lakh (Rupees Eighteen Lakh Fifty-Eight Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy-Four only)**, after deducting the unspent balance of Rs. 56.35178 lakh, carried forward from the previous financial year, to the State Government of Himachal Pradesh for implementation of the Externally Aided GOI-UNDP-GEF “Securing Livelihoods, Conservation, Sustainable use and Restoration of High Range Himalayan Ecosystems (SECURE Himalaya Project), in Himachal Pradesh.

3. The funds, being released as mentioned above, are provisional and subject to audit by CAG empanelled Chartered Accountant/Firm. Further, the funds would also be subject to adjustments as per the terms and conditions levied at the time of approval of financial assistance for the scheme.

4. The State Government of Himachal Pradesh should ensure that:

- I. All procurement/consultancies are awarded as per GFR 2017; GFR is followed by implementing agency along with the economic instructions issued by the Government of India from time to time.
- II. The expenditure should be incurred during the financial year 2022-23 on the sanctioned items of work as enumerated in ANNEXURE and no deviation is made without the prior approval of this Ministry
- III. The expenditure incurred remains identifiable and quarterly reimbursement claims are forwarded to this Ministry.



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- IV. The expenditure to be incurred conforms to the extant norms/regulations of the Government of India and also to the procurement procedure/guidelines of the UNDP. Otherwise, it will not be reimbursable and remain outstanding against the State Government of Himachal Pradesh
- V. Duly audited utilization certificates as per the format [General Financial Rule-239 form (12C)] along with physical/financial progress reports are furnished to the Ministry for the release of next installment. Statement of Expenditure, satellite photographs and latitude longitude coordinates before and after completion of work to be obtained and uploaded on the website of the implementing agency as well as of the Ministry for public access.
- VI. The interest accrued on the amount of Grants-in-Aid (General) is to be accounted as per the provisions in General Financial Rules, 2017.
- VII. The State Government of Himachal Pradesh will provide quarterly physical and financial progress reports to this Ministry.
- VIII. There should not be any overlapping of activities/duplication of work under the project with the activities of ongoing scheme of Central/State Government.
- IX. All payments are made by bank transfer, where applicable through DBT particularly of labourers, and no cash payment is to be made.
- X. Evidence of deposit of TDS, in case of contract payment and leviable goods, are obtained along with the UC and compliance of DBT scheme must be ensured in all payments where applicable.
- XI. In case of employment through contract, copy of PF & ESI contributions of employees shall be obtained, wherever applicable.
- XII. If the implementing agency does not use the Grant for the purpose for which it was released, the Implementing Agency has to refund the same with interest. Directions of Ministry of Finance shall be followed in this regard.
- XIII. The Fixed Assets created out of this grant shall not be disposed-off without approval of this Ministry.
- XIV. The members of scheduled caste/tribe communities are involved in all the "Securing livelihoods, conservation, sustainable use and restoration of high range Himalayan ecosystems (SECURE Himalaya) project activities and gender equality is maintained.
- XV. A separate bank account shall be opened for the purpose and the account shall be open for audit by Central Government or C&AG.
- XVI. Evidence of deposit of GST is to be obtained.
- XVII. The Grant is to be utilized with due approval of the competent authority/s.

5. The sanction shall be subject to the provisions contained in the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972, as amended till date, Wetland (Conservation & Management) Rules, 2017, Forest Conservation Act, 1980, Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, Biological Diversity Act, 2002 along with the amendments from time to time and rules framed thereunder.

6. The funds are subject to terms and conditions contained in the signed Project Document between the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, New Delhi – 110003; UNDP India and accepted by the Government of Himachal Pradesh.

7. In accordance with the revised procedure, the Reserve Bank of India may please be advised to pass on the credit to the central accounts section, Nagpur for transferring the funds to the account of the Government of Himachal Pradesh and to debit Rs. 18.58774 lakh (Rupees Eighteen Lakh Fifty-Eight Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy-Four only), to the account of The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India, New Delhi.




8. The expenditure involved is debited to the Major Head '3601' Grants-In-aid to States Governments (Major Head) 3601.06-Centrally Sponsored Schemes (Sub Major Head), 3601.06.102-Externally Aided Projects – Grants for Centrally Sponsored Scheme (Minor Head), 3601.06.102.31- Integrated Development of Wildlife Habitats (Sub Head), 3601.06.102.31.01- Development of Wildlife Habitats (Detailed Head), 3601.06.102.31.01.31 - Grants-in-Aid-General under Demand No. 28 of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change for the year 2022-23.

9. This is issued with the approval of competent authority and with the concurrence of the Integrated Finance Division of this Ministry vide its Computer Dy. No. 141186 dated 16-12-2022 under the power delegated to Ministries/Department and IFD unique No 234/IFD/2023 dated 25-1-2023.
