ORDER:

The Thirteenth Finance Commission has recommended a total Grants-in-aid of Rs.252.44 crore to the State of Tamil Nadu towards Improving Justice Delivery. Based on the recommendation, the Government of India has released a sum of Rs.25.2430 crore as first instalment grants-in-aid for the year 2010-2011 for improvement in Delivery of Justice. Out of Rs.252.44 crore Grants-in-aid, grant of Rs.7.41 Crore has been recommended for imparting training to the Prosecutors in Tamil Nadu and a sum of Rs.74.10 Lakh has been released by the Government of India as first instalment Grants-in-aid for this purpose for the year 2010-2011.

2. In the letter read above, the Director of Prosecution (i/c), Chennai has stated that a committee was constituted with the following Deputy Directors of Prosecution and Additional Public Prosecutors to suggest topic-wise syllabus, in order to identify the fields and laws under which training has to be given to the Prosecutors:

- 1) Thiru.S.Easwaramoorthy, Deputy Director of Prosecution, Salem
- 2) Thiru. S. Kandasamy, Additional Public Prosecutor, Chennai
- 3) Thiru. K.S. Prabhakaran, Additional Public Prosecutor, Madurai
- 4) Thiru. S. Rajamanickam, Additional Public Prosecutor, Villupuram.

The Committee has submitted its report to the Director of Prosecution (i/c). In this report, the Committee has suggested for imparting training to the Public Prosecutors in the following subjects

(P.T.O.)

including the administrative training consisting of 40 classes for 10 days (i.e. 4 classes per day) as detailed below :-

The Director of Prosecution (i/c), Chennai has also stated that the Director, Anna Institute of Management has accepted to conduct a 10 days residential programme for the Prosecutors in the fields of Criminal Procedure Code, Indian Penal Code, Civil Procedure Code, Special Act, Service Rules, Disciplinary Proceedings, Fundamentals of Computers. In order to make it a holistic programme, Anna Institute of management will arrange Yoga classes in the mornings for the participants. A session on Stress Management by an eminent speaker will also be arranged by them. The Anna Institute of management will also provide books as reading material as indicated by the Director of Prosecution. As resource persons are likely to be high ranking persons, Anna Institute of Management will also be providing conveyance for their pick-up and drop back within the city wherever necessary. In order to ensure liaison with the participants, a co-ordinator will be identified by the Director of Prosecution for each batch of the training programme. The Course fee will be Rs.3,75,550/- (Rupees Three lakh seventy five thousand five hundred and fifty only) per batch. The course fee is inclusive of faculty input, books as reading material, food

(breakfast, lunch, coffee/tea, dinner etc) and accommodation charges (non A/c – twin sharing basis). The programme will be conducted at Anna Institute of Management, Chennai. 30 Participants may be nominated for each batch. The total number of batches may be decided based on the number of participants to be covered. The dates may be finalized based on mutually convenient basis.

4. The Director of Prosecution (i/c), Chennai has also stated that there are 389 Prosecutors working under the control of the Director of Prosecution namely, Joint Director of Prosecution, Deputy Director of Prosecution, Assistant Director of Prosecution / Additional Public Prosecutors, Assistant Public Prosecutors Grade I and Grade II. The Director of Prosecution is supervising and monitoring the work of the above said prosecuting officers. 388 Prosecutors excluding the Joint Director of Prosecution, working under the control of the Director of Prosecution have to be given training by utilizing the funds allotted by the 13th Finance Commission. In addition to the above said 388 Prosecutors, 257 tenure basis prosecutors who are appointed by the Government on the recommendation of Collector of the Districts concerned are working under the administrative control of the Collector and they have also to be given training by utilizing the funds provided by the 13th Finance Commission. Thus, there are altogether 645 Prosecutors to be given training. The above said prosecutors have to be divided into 21 batches and 10 days training for each batch will be given excluding holidays of Saturday and Sunday. Training will be given for four sessions per day and the duration for each session will be 1½ hours.

5. The Director of Prosecution (i/c), Chennai has, therefore, requested for sanction of funds to the Anna Institute of Management for giving batch-wise training to the Prosecutors and to give necessary instructions to the Collector of the Districts concerned to spare the services of the tenure prosecutors whose names are found in the schedule of training programme fixed by the Anna Institute of Management so as to enable them to attend the training to be conducted by the Anna Institute of Management, Chennai.

6. The proposal of the Director of Prosecution (i/c), Chennai has been placed before the High Level Monitoring Committee constituted for this purpose under the chairmanship of Chief Secretary to Government and the committee in its meeting held on 16.11.2010 has approved the proposal of the Director of Prosecution (i/c), Chennai for sanction of Rs.78.87 lakh to the Anna Institute of Management for giving batch-wise training to the prosecutors.

7. Taking into consideration of the decision of High Level Monitoring Committee, the Government accord sanction for a sum of Rs.78.87 lakh (Rupees Seventy eight lakh and eighty seven thousand only) for giving training to the 645 Prosecutors (both regular and tenure) in Tamil Nadu into 21 batches for 10 days (each batch consisting of 30 participants) in the Anna Institute of Management, Chennai as per the topic-wise syllabus along with Yoga and Stress Management classes to be arranged by the Anna Institute of Management for the year 2010-2011. The details of topic-wise syllabus and the number of classes to be conducted by the Anna Institute of Management for giving training to the Prosecuting Officers and the schedule of training for the prosecuting officers are furnished in Annexure - I and Annexure - II to this order.

8. The Director of Prosecution (i/c), Chennai is appointed as co-ordinator for this purpose.

9. The Director of Prosecution (i/c), Chennai is requested to identify the faculty members in consultation with the Registrar General, High Court of Madras, Chennai.

10. The Director of Prosecution (i/c), Chennai / District Collectors are requested to spare the services of the regular / tenure prosecutors so as to attend the training to be conducted by the Anna Institute of Management, Chennai - 28 as per the schedule of the programme as detailed in Annexure - II enclosed to this order.

11. The expenditure sanctioned in para 7 above shall be debited under the following head of account:-
